

Nandi County, Kenya, co-created the Nandi Data Desk, a tool that empowers citizens to oversee the government's activity.

Easy Government

Aragón, Spain, invites people with disabilities to redesign legal and administrative texts using easy reading, and create simpler and clearer products for all audiences.

Citizen Power

Glasgow, UK, is exploring models of Citizen Power that are embedded in the way the city functions to create sustainable changes.

Medicine Tracker


Contagem, Brazil, developed a digital platform that enables citizens who rely on municipal pharmacies to track the availability of medicines across pharmacy units.

- By government official

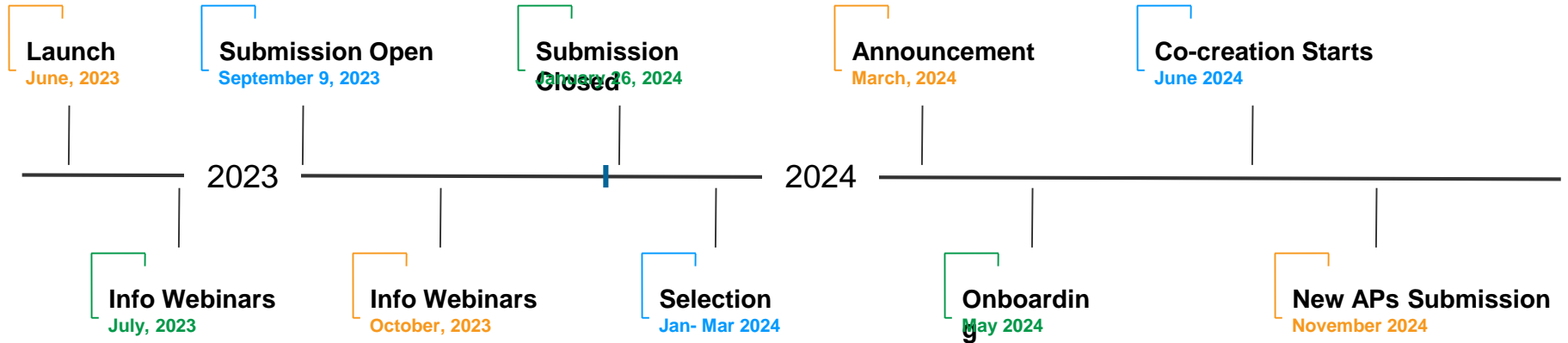
Letters of Support
